MSCA Seal of Excellence @ Italian Institute for Genomic Medicine

The Italian Institute for Genomic Medicine (IIGM) is pleased to announce a new initiative aimed at funding research projects submitted in response to the European programme Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions (MSCA) Individual Fellowships call (MSCA-IF-2020), and which were awarded the Seal of Excellence.

This call is part of the Compagnia di San Paolo's strategy for strengthening the competitiveness of Piedmont and Liguria in research and innovation through initiatives that promote the mobility of international researchers to these regions. IIGM is willing to evaluate applications from candidates who obtained the "Seal of Excellence" in response to the European call MSCA-IF-2020, and who wish to carry on their project at the Italian Institute for Genomic Medicine in the "molecular biology, experimental oncology, immunology, genomics" areas, even if IIGM was not indicated as the project Host Institution in the original application.

To apply, interested candidates should send the following by November 15, 2021:

- Candidate's CV and a copy of the ID card;
- Copy of the project submitted to the European Commission in response to the MSCA Call (Part A and Part B);
- Copy of the Evaluation Summary Report (ESR) received from the European Commission following the evaluation, stating the final score obtained;
- Copy of the "Seal of Excellence" certificate issued by the European Commission.

IIGM will select the most promising applications to be considered for the Compagnia di San Paolo's call.

If awarded, successful candidates will carry out the(ir) research project at IIGM for the same duration as stated in the original MSCA application, and (they) will receive a salary equivalent to the amount of MSCA fellowships provided by the European Commission. Where necessary – for example if the Host Institution in the original application was based in a different country – the total award amount will be recalculated using the coefficient for Italy. The activation of the "family allowance" item will be evaluated at the time the grant is awarded, according to the fellow's needs.
